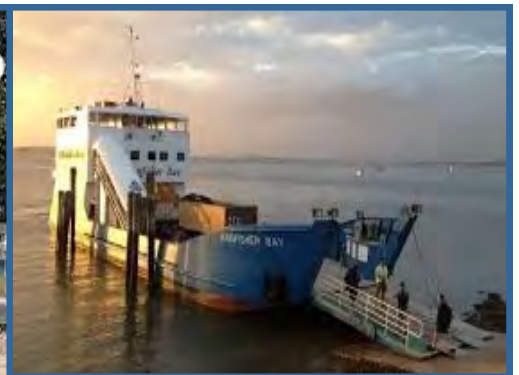

PRESIDENT'S REPORT - JUNE 2020

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL IS DUE AT THE END OF JUNE 2020.

I am happy to say that all being well, Friday night cafe and bar will re-open on Friday 10 July. Social distancing measures **will be in place but with this in mind we can still cater to our usual number of patrons. It's been a long, hard road, particularly** hard on our financial situation but we have measures in place to hopefully combat this, given that we will not have had any revenue for four months with the substantial bills still having to be paid.

To give you an idea of the approximate yearly major outlays here they are:

\$9,120 – Power and fuel

\$5,859 – Insurance

\$9,316 – Cleaning

\$2,537 - Office expenses

\$6,178 – Repairs and maintenance

\$9,600 - Kitchen staff

We are extremely grateful to Liz Stewart, our Chef, and Rob Stewart, our Cleaner, who have both offered to take a reduction in fees to help build up our finances. A big thank you to you both! When the chips are down our community comes shining through! We are also looking to have some volunteer plating/serving staff to assist Liz on Friday evenings. Anyone interested should phone 0499 992 442. If any high school students are interested, they will receive training, assistance with gaining their Food Hygiene Accreditation and a Certificate of Competency from the RHPA for their resume. The hours are 5.15pm to 7.30pm Fridays.

We applied for and were successful in obtaining a Covid19 Support Grant from Council. Whilst we have not yet received this into our bank account, it will be a huge help in keeping your Association viable. A big thank you to Council for this measure.

Membership renewal is due at the end of June. The membership fee has been increased from \$15 per annum to \$20 per person per annum (this is only the second increase in fees since 1994 so is well overdue). This includes a meal to the value of \$15.00 on your birthday so you pretty much get your renewal fee back on your birthday. There are also several other benefits including discounts on meals for members, discounted hall hire, discounted party equipment hire and so forth.

The community hall continues to be closed to all activities for now. Quilting will resume Monday, 15 June and Pool as soon as we receive the renewal on our Liquor Permit, numbers permitting. Depending on number, indoor bowls could also resume at this time. Our lovely Librarian, Keran Smee, has offered to assist anyone who would like to borrow/return books, borrow puzzles or games while the hall is closed. Keran is prepared to be contacted on 4125 8191 or mobile 0407 456 127. She will allow access to the library one person at a time if you phone her to make an appointment – between the hours of 9am to 5pm only please. As books/games etc are returned they will be carefully sanitised to eliminate spread of disease but as an extra precaution please wear gloves when entering the library. Thank you Keran. Community morning tea will resume on Tuesday, 16 June. Social distancing and hygiene measures will apply to all activities and hand sanitizer will be at front desk. Thank you to Mark McMurtrie, our Pharmacist, for provision of the sanitizer.

Help is available for any people feeling the effects of the corona virus isolation measures. Also, please feel free to phone 0499 992 442 if you are in need of assistance.

Sue Church has diligently prepared our accounts for auditing. They are with the auditor as we go to print. Thank you Sue for undertaking this huge job!

We are saddened to be saying goodbye to our Local Member, Ted Sorensen who has announced his retirement from State politics after a long and distinguished career firstly as Mayor of Hervey Bay and then as our State Member for many years. Ted and wife, Jenny, are also Life Members of RHPA. Ted has always supported our endeavours. We have only had to ask if he could attend a gathering and he is there (if he is not in Canberra doing the politician thing). We hope Ted and Jenny will come and socialise with us at the hall. To Ted and Jenny we say a very big thank you for all your support over the years.

LNP State Member for Hervey Bay Ted Sorensen has today announced his retirement from public life at the next state election.

"It has been an honour and privilege to serve the people of Hervey Bay for nearly 27 years," Mr Sorensen said.

"I have had a fulfilling life serving the public and my wife Jenny and I have many great memories to take with us, while we relax a little.

"My sincere love and thanks to my wife Jenny who has made all these things possible. I could not have done it without her.

"I would also like to thank my staff Paula and Deb for their continued dedication and commitment.

"Sincere thanks to all the people of Hervey Bay who have supported me over the many years - your continued endorsement was uplifting and humbling.

"To all Hervey Bay LNP members, who have stood strongly beside me, who held the LNP's values strong at every election with tremendous professionalism, my sincerest appreciations and you have my gratitude."

Mr Sorensen said some of his career highlights included building a better Hervey Bay Airport terminal and extending the runway to take flights from Sydney and establishing a new cancer and dental clinic and also a Renal unit so people did not have to travel to Gympie or Nambour for health services.

"Most of all, it's the achievements that I cannot freely talk about that I will hold dear to my heart," Mr Sorensen said.

"I found it extremely rewarding and satisfying to assist people going through difficult times, where individuals did not fit the group mould in state legislation, and fighting for them to make their lives better, even if I had to advocate strongly to change legislation to succeed."

LNP Leader Deb Frecklington today thanked Ted for his dedicated service to the people of Hervey Bay and the people of Queensland.

"Ted has been a fierce advocate for his community for nearly 27 years," Ms Frecklington said.

"Born and raised in the 'Bay', Ted started his public service as a councillor in 1994 before becoming Mayor in 2000. Ted made the transition to the state arena in 2009 and has been a dedicated representative of the people of Hervey Bay in Parliament ever since.

"I wish Ted and his wife Jenny all the best."

"Ted always stood up for what he believed in. In his maiden speech Ted said 'I will work hard to represent and protect our lifestyle for future generations and endeavour to see that Hervey Bay gets it fair share'. Ted did that in spades.

"A passionate advocate for better health services, in government Ted delivered a \$17 million healthcare centre that included 14 chemotherapy chairs and 16 dental chairs and was a champion of the LNP's policy to clear dental waiting lists.

"Ted also secured the Hervey Bay State High School a new sport centre, 15 classrooms as well as a \$1.5 million artificial reef project which will establish two artificial reefs in the Great Sandy Straits.

"After such a magnificent contribution to public life, I am sure Ted is now looking forward to his retirement and spending more time with his wife Jenny, children and his many grandchildren.

"I know one thing for sure, Ted will be reacquainting himself with his rod and reel and will keep a close eye on the quality of mud crab stocks in the years ahead!"

FRASER COAST RV PARK NEWS

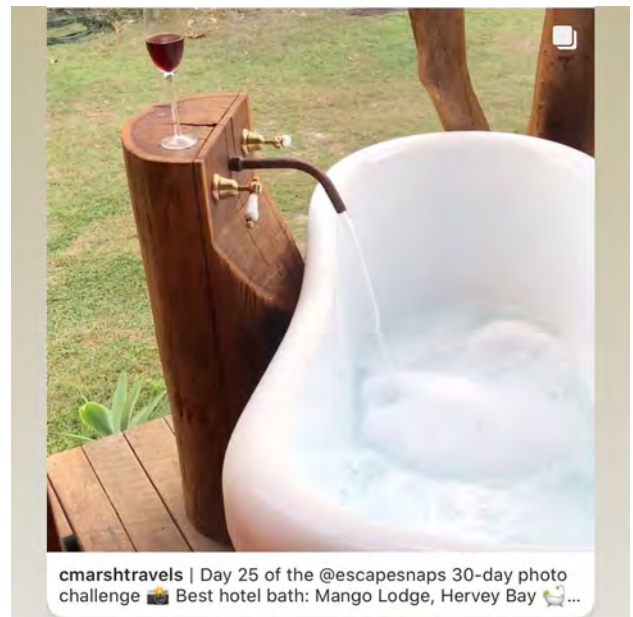

All bookings for the park have to be pre-made so that remote access can be generated for the security gate.

18 March

Mum "No soccer for 4 weeks! What will you do with the boys on Saturdays?"

D "No soccer, basketball, swimming, touch footy....or any sports at the moment. All soccer training suspended until May 1st. No youth group, no band practice, no Regional Carnival, no cross country, no school assemblies. All activities have been replaced by the Hand Washing Olympics!"

D "Happy birthday twice. For me I sing once in English then in Indonesian, which translates "long years of life!"

D "Shops are crazy down here too! Although I've managed to get meatballs. Beans are the go."

19 March

Mum "Did Tim and Ian get back from overseas yet?"

D "Just Tim so far. Ian is still on some remote island in Indonesia surfing. Katho is very worried."

Mum "Yes! We have a lady whose grandson is stuck in India with a singing group tour! I'm getting extra 25Gig free from Telstra! Dad can watch more sailing on YouTube!"

D "Silver lining!"

20 March

Mum "Hi. What are you thinking about going to Uluru now that Qantas won't fly from Alice Springs to Uluru?"

D "Not sure yet. Will possibly need to defer it."

22 March








