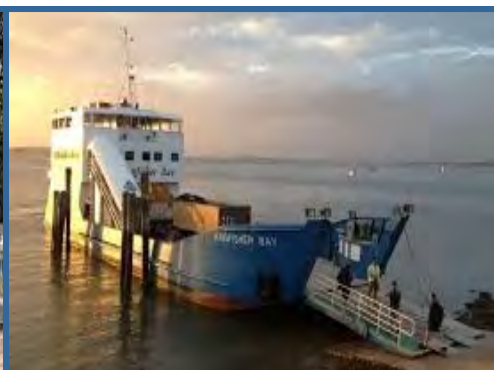

A big thank you to our wonderful fireies who are working tirelessly to contain this menace to the Island's ecology, wildlife and economic viability.

The idea is that anyone can attend for a gold coin donation which will go to the Just for Kids Charity. Suzanne and Paul from the RV Park are organising these nights in conjunction with RHPA.



HISTORIAN MESSAGE

In 2024 the River Heads Progress Association will celebrate 40 years of continuous operation and your assistance may be able to help celebrate this milestone. The River Heads Progress Association dates back to 1994, and the Hall opening back to 2000.

River Heads has a long history: Firstly in Turtle Cove as a Butchella meeting and fishing gathering place with connection to K'gari and the Bunya Mountains. This was followed by European settlement, the importance of the passage of sailing ships through the heads to the town of Maryborough, including the Ship Ariadne.

As a member for the RHPA, prior to the hall construction, there have been many periods of effort and lobbying:

- The upgrade of River Heads Road with final approval in 2004 and construction completed in 2006.
- The River Heads Reserve Project Concept Master Plan 2006 to 2007 followed by the GFC.
- Then 2009 to 2011 with rare Federal Government grants for the environmental aspects of the plan, planting many hundreds of trees.
- The next phase at the Reserve from 2011 to date with the community facilities oval, pathways, and shed.

The RHPA Hall has expanded its operation and facilities with regular activities, but there are many gaps in this brief timeline. Pre 1994 and the early settlement is a period that I hope to video and discuss with retired MP Ted Sorensen, since he has lived here all his life.

We plan to create a slide projection to be used at the celebration with many photos. It may also be possible to produce a small booklet for the event. Therefore, if you have any photos of local activities that fall in any of this timeline or before 1994, I can be contacted by emailing historian@riverheads.org.au . We can then arrange to meet at the Hall.
