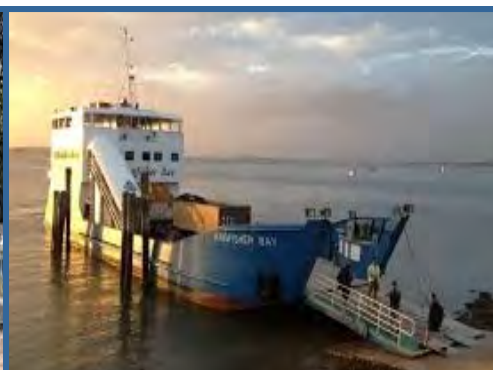

Well, the hall has re-opened and we are set for another rewarding and exciting year here in River Heads. I trust you all had an enjoyable and safe Christmas break.

Sadly, we had to cancel our usual Australia Day celebrations this year. As you can imagine there is a lot of work involved in organising these events not to mention the outlay. Last year's attendance was not good and this, coupled with the uncertainty over COVID, made running the event financially unviable. I trust you all understand. We hope that this curse of COVID is over soon, although we have been pretty lucky in this area. Problem is lockdowns can happen at the drop of a hat, as recently occurred in Greater Brisbane.

You have probably noticed that solar power is now installed at the hall thanks to Sunjuice and a grant of \$15,950 from the COVID Infrastructure Grant from Qld Sport & Rec and \$4,000 from Cr David Lewis' Discretionary Fund. A big thank you! It is a 30kw system which will more than cover our power needs. We will soon see the benefit of the system which will have a great impact on our crippling power bills.

Now all we need is to aircon the hall so we are working on getting another grant for that at the moment.

Update on Wilkins Street Development: The Developer, Peter Chen, has advised that he has a prospective investor who is about to sign a Letter of Intent so it looks like that development will proceed.

Update on Turtle Cove Development: As you know, the Federal Government rejected the application based on the harm it would cause to the environment, particularly the habitat of the critically endangered Eastern Curlew bird species. However, the Developer is still trying to garner support for the development and we understand is considering submitting another application. Will keep you posted on this.

We have a wealth of sporting talent in our community plus a fantastic playing field and canteen at the Reserve in Seafarer Avenue, so let's get mobilised!! New mobile phone app makes it easier to use library services

Fraser Coast Libraries have launched a new app which will make it easier for people with smart mobile phones to use the service.

Members won't have to carry their library cards because their barcode will be recorded on the app. Library users will also be able to link family members and friends, with their permission of course, on the app to make it easier to loan items on their behalf – which will be a big help to parents borrowing for children.

People with the latest mobile phones will be able to use their devices to borrow books and other materials, simply by holding the items close to their phone. If you are in a shop and see a book you want to read, scan the barcode to see if the libraries stocked it and reserve a copy on the spot.

WHAT WILL THE NEW YEAR BRING?

This year you will face some mountains and go through some valleys. And you need both. The strength gained from climbing and conquering your last mountain is what will get you through your next valley. It's in the valley that the sweetest fruit grows. That's because it's watered by streams that flow from the mountains.

Jesus said, 'By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit'. (John 15:8^{NKJV}) This year Jesus wants you to be more fruitful in His service. And He tells you how: 'Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me. I am the Vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing'. (John 15:4–5^{NKJV})

What kind of fruit is God looking for in your life this year? Paul tells us: 'When the Holy Spirit controls our lives He will produce this kind of fruit in us: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control'. (Galatians 5:22–23^{TLB}) It's not a matter of working industriously and efficiently to produce a bountiful harvest out of your own efforts - it's a matter of abiding in the Vine (Jesus) so that He can bring forth good fruit in us.

So this year when you face a mountain or go through a valley, remember that God is with you and He will help you if you put your trust in Him.



HISTORIAN MESSAGE

ARRIVAL OF THE ARIADNE, IMMIGRANT SHIP, AT MARYBOROUGH - 1862

The Ariadne, ship, 670 tons, Captain J. Brown, from Liverpool on the 5th June, arrived in Wide Bay on Sunday last, with 259 government immigrants on board, and about 200 tons of cargo.

The Maryborough Chronicle, of the 9th inst., gives the sub-joined particulars:-

"With the exception of a little scurvy, the passengers all appear in excellent health. Mr. Sheridan boarded the vessel towards the north end of Great Sandy Island, and experienced no difficulty in bringing her to an anchorage off the Heads of the Mary; he (Mr. S.) reports the vessel as being very clean and orderly. There have been 6 or 7 deaths and 6 births during the voyage, which lasted 120 days. The deaths, with one exception, were all infants, and occurred from the following causes:

2 bronchitis after measles, 1 dysentery, 1 whooping cough, 1 convulsions, 1 adult, scurvy.

On the whole the Surgeon Superintendent, Dr. Holman, speaks favourably of the immigrants.

"Yesterday morning, at eight o'clock, the Telegraph, from Rockhampton, steamed alongside the Ariadne, and by eleven the whole of the immigrants, with their chattels, had been transhipped.

Immediately as the steamer moved off, the Ariadne fired a parting salute of eleven guns having been previously dressed out with all her flags. The immigrants gave three cheers for the captain, the doctor, and the commissioners, and thus terminated a trip which, for mutual satisfaction, we will venture to repeat, has been seldom equalled on board ships arriving under similar circumstances. At one o'clock precisely the Telegraph, decked in her gayest flags steamed up to the wharf and by four o'clock the whole of the immigrants were snugly housed in the stores engaged by the Government to receive them.

As usual with vessels arriving in this colony, the crew of the Ariadne showed unmistakable manifestations of insubordination, and two of the ringleaders were in consequence brought up in irons, but it is believed the remainder will return to their duty."

WILDLIFE MATTERS (WILDLIFE QLD FRASER COAST)

Great things are happening at Tandora.

Tandora is a 4400 hectare cattle station bordered by the Mary and Susan Rivers between Maryborough and Hervey Bay and owned by the Titmarsh family since 1907.

The current owners are Lindsay and Noela. Lindsay has shared his wealth of knowledge regarding Tandora's history, from indigenous habitation to the present day, in three books.

In the early twentieth century, there were local accounts of abundant wildlife, including koalas. Inconceivable to us today, koalas were once hunted for their pelts. During the last open season beginning in 1927 nearly one million animals were killed.

In recent decades, koala numbers have plummeted in Tinana due to disease, development and road kills. Carer Natalie Richardson suggested that the vulnerable koalas be relocated to a safe location after veterinary treatment and recovery - an idea thought to be quite impracticable. Official policy was to return koalas to where they were picked up. The Richardson family, with forty years experience caring for injured wildlife, could not see the logic of returning saved koalas to the same threatening environment at Tinana.

Natalie convinced fauna experts that a "planned transportation" should be tried. Tandora was chosen as an extremely safe place to re-establish the colony.

Apparently, relocation is not a new idea in Queensland, with eight koalas brought to Noosa in the Sixties, when native forests north of Brisbane were destroyed in preparation for the establishment of pine plantations.

Under the guidance of Queensland University ecologists, Drs. Sean FitzGibbon and Amber Gillett, two koalas, Cobber and Chelsea, were released at Tandora in 2014. Cobber, with tracking collar attached decided to abscond but was returned and consequently found the property to be quite congenial.

The colony is growing with a new generation. The first joey born in 2016, was named "Gordon" after Lindsay's father. All of the koalas are given health checks every three months by Sean, Amber and team. Radio transmission collars make location easy.

We can be assured that the Tandora koalas are in very capable hands.

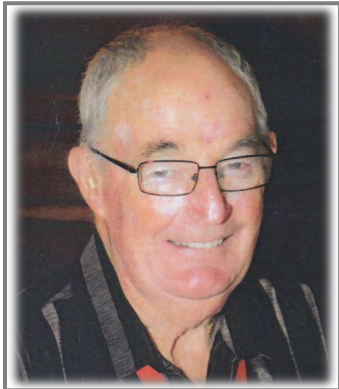
