Seared tuna salad with radish, finger lime and citrus vinaigrette

Ingredients

700g sashimi grade tuna loin 2tsp Dijon mustard

2tblsp extra virgin olive oil

2 finger limes, pearls removed

1 baby fennel (180g) shaved, fronds reserved

- 1 small Lebanese cucumber (150g) sliced
- 3 mixed baby heirloom radishes, shaved
- 1 jalapeno thinly sliced

Crushed pink peppercorns/ micro mitsuba to serve

Spice Mix

2tsp ground paprika 1tsp ground sumac

½tsp ground coriander

Citrus vinaigrette

21/2 tblsp each orange juice and olive oil 3tsp soy sauce 11/2tsp white wine vinegar



Method

- 1. Lay one sheet of plastic wrap on work bench big enough to fit tuna with a 10cm overhang. Wipe with a damp cloth, lay another sheet over top and push down so they stick together. Repeat to make three layers. Place tuna at short end of plastic wrap and roll tightly to make a log. Twist ends tightly and tie a knot to secure. Refrigerate overnight to set.
- 2. Unroll tuna and discard plastic. Combine spices and ½ tsp sea salt flakes on a large plate. Brush tuna with mustard and roll in spices to coat evenly. Heat oil in a large pan over high heat and sear tuna, turning frequently, until browned all over but still rare in middle (3-5 minutes). Transfer to a board and rest until cool (10 minutes).
- 3. Repeat step 1 so you have three layers of plastic wrap. Roll tuna, secure tightly and refrigerate for another 4-5 hours to set.
- 4. For vinaigrette, place ingredients in a bowl, season and whisk to combine.
- 5. To serve, remove tuna from fridge. Discard plastic wrap and thinly slice. Arrange tuna on a platter. Top with finger lime, fennel, cucumber, radish, jalapeño, pink peppercorn, and micro mitsuba. Drizzle seared tuna salad with dressing.

Hervey Bay unleashes the fun with A Dog's Day Out

A Dog's Day Out in Hervey Bay next month promises to be a fur-tastic day for local dogs and their owners, with a rescue dog catwalk, agility demonstrations, and a vet advice session among the highlights.

Fraser Coast Mayor George Seymour said the popular event was returning to Dayman Park, Urangan on Sunday, October 13 from 8am to 12 noon, where Council will be looking for Hervey Bay's best-dressed dog and celebrating responsible dog ownership.

"A Dog's Day Out in Hervey Bay coincides with the annual dog registration renewal period with renewal notices being issued from late September and payments due by October 31," he said.

"At this year's event, we are also offering dog owners the chance to win a \$200 Fraser Coast Buy Local Gift Card if they renew their dog registrations at the event.

"This is a great incentive to renew registrations while socialising your dog and enjoying a fun day out with the whole family.

"Free microchipping will be available and our Customer Service team will be on hand to register pets free for the first time.

"In the Fraser Coast, it is compulsory for dogs to be registered with Council from 12 weeks of age and within 14 days of owners moving to the region.

"Ensuring your dog is registered and microchipped helps reduce the number of animals that end up at the animal facility and makes it easier for Council to reunite lost pets with their owners."

Cr Seymour said if you've recently had your dog desexed and hold a Concession Card, you could be eligible for a \$100 reimbursement, with desexing reimbursement forms available at the event.

"The fun day will also feature market stalls showcasing pet products, demonstrations, pet advice, a rescue dog catwalk, and dog training tips and tricks." he said.

"There will also be prizes for the best-dressed dog, best dog trick, and an owner look-alike competition."

Fraser Coast residents are encouraged to clear out and cash in on the Garage Sale Trail this November – the nation's biggest second-hand treasure hunt.

Mayor George Seymour said Fraser Coast Regional Council was proud to be one of over 80 councils across Australia supporting the campaign this year, which aims to encourage people to learn about the circular economy and the benefits of reuse.

"The trail will be coming to the Fraser Coast over two big weekends on the 9-10 and 16-17 November, with the event offering savings for savvy shoppers on everything from the essentials you need to the pre-loved gems you want," he said.

"Local residents, schools, and community groups are invited to host their own garage sale or join a group sale, and you can take part over one day or do more across both weekends.

"Council will be partnering with Reuse & Recycle Group Inc to host group sales at our tip shops in Hervey Bay on November 9 and 16 and in Maryborough on November 10 and 17.

"Residents who would like to take part in the Garage

Sale Trail but don't have the space themselves or don't want to do a sale at their home can register their interest to join the tip shop group sales."

Cr Seymour said selling or shopping at garage sales is a simple way to reduce our carbon footprint and an example of the circular economy in action.

"The Garage Sale Trail helps neighbours connect, make some money and keep their good stuff out of landfill," he said.

"Those holding a sale on the trail make an average of \$457, proving that pre-loved is both environmentally friendly and pocket-friendly."

Garage Sale Trail is not-for-profit social enterprise that seeks to educate Australians on the importance of reuse and the need to take individual responsibility for the impact of our consumption habits. It started as a grassroots idea in Bondi Beach in 2010 and has grown to become a nationwide initiative in 2024.

Unhealthy fig trees to be removed for public safety

Two fig trees on the Hervey Bay Esplanade near the WetSide Water Park will be removed, and maintenance will be carried out on seven others to ensure community safety.

Fraser Coast Regional Council Open Space and Environment Executive Manager Max Corte said the Weeping Figs had been part of the Pialba foreshore since the 1930s, but unfortunately, their health had significantly worsened over time.

"Council arborists have been aware of the trees' declining conditions through routine maintenance inspections and have done extensive work to extend their lifespan to this point," he said.

"Council also sought advice from two independent arborists who confirmed the findings and recommended action.

"Two of the nine trees must be removed entirely, while the others will undergo ongoing inspections

and varying levels of pruning to reduce weight.

"In addition, Council will conduct remedial work to improve soil health and support the trees' root systems.

"We understand these trees have historical significance and are much loved by the community, but public safety must come first. This decision wasn't made lightly, and we are taking this action only because it is absolutely necessary.

"Replacement planting is already underway, and cuttings will be taken from the trees to help preserve them through replanting."

Mr Corte said the removal and maintenance work would occur over two days in mid-October, during which there will be some road closures and pedestrian restrictions.

Vibrant new exhibitions to open at Hervey Bay gallery

A colourful reimagining of south-east Queensland suburban life, an exploration of sustainable timber use and a showcase of local artistic talent are all part of the new exhibitions opening at the Hervey Bay Regional Gallery this weekend.

Fraser Coast Regional Council Arts spokesperson Michelle Govers said Brisbane artist Phoebe Paradise is known for her vibrant illustrations, murals and public art installations, with her new exhibition examining the charm of suburban life.

"Burbs to the Bay reimagines south-east Queensland suburbia with vibrant streetscapes and surreal architecture, bringing the essence of subtropical Queensland to life in a colourful, dreamlike world," Cr Govers said.

Phoebe recently collaborated with local artists Matthew Graveson and Halle Bryant on a stunning 10-metre mural in the Hervey Bay Regional Gallery foyer as part of a mentorship program supported by the Regional Arts Development Fund.



The Cheeky Home Cook creates – Tomato and avocado salad

Ingredients

4-5 tomatoes, sliced

Sea salt and freshly ground black pepper

2 garlic cloves, finely chopped

1/2 red onion, finely sliced

1 avocado, diced into 2 cm pieces

1 handful of mixed herbs, such as basil, mint, oregano, roughly chopped

2-3 tblsp red wine vinegar or apple cider vinegar 1/3 cup extra virgin olive oil

Method

Place the tomatoes on a platter and season with the salt and pepper, sprinkle over the garlic

Arrange the red onion on the tomato then add the avocado and herbs

Whisk the vinegar and olive oil in a small bowl until well combined

Drizzle the dressing over the tomato salad, add a little more salt and pepper if desired. Serve.


