Happy Valley to receive new Fire Emergency Services Tanks

In late 2020, a catastrophic fire burned one half of our world heritage listed Fraser (K'gari) island and came close to destroying the beautiful township of Happy Valley.

The Happy Valley Rural Fire Brigade barely had enough water to extinguish a house fire let alone a fire threatening to engulf Happy Valley, and the entire Fraser (K'gari) Island.

It's critical that the Happy Valley Rural Fire Brigade has access to fit for purpose fire protection services at the right place and at the right time. I am pleased to announce that a permit has been granted for the installation of a 100,000-litre static water supply in Happy Valley. I commend the Happy Valley Community Association and all the other Rural Fire Brigades for their tenacity and courage in protecting our lives, homes and communities.

Scott Bell and Darren Gorlick have worked incredibly hard toward the creation of a Happy Valley emergency precinct, and access to a reliable hydrant and static water supply is a critical step in the process. They have raised the funds to purchase the static water tanks at no cost to

the State Government. It beggars belief that the Happy Valley Rural Fire Brigade would barely have access to enough water to extinguish a house fire let alone defend the entire township.

I acknowledge and thank the Hon Dale Last, Minister for Natural Resources and Hon Anne Leahy, Minister for Fire, Disaster Recovery and Volunteers for their advocacy and assistance throughout the application process.

We're also excited to kick off the New Year with our next Fundraising Joy Flight event, taking place on January 9, 10 and 11, 2026. These joy flights are




a wonderful way to support Community Flights while experiencing the beauty of our region from the air.



A huge thank you to our committee and helpers who worked tirelessly to make sure every member felt celebrated, your massive effort did not go unnoticed.



Council backs vital emergency services on Fraser Coast

Fraser Coast Regional Council has renewed and expanded its support for three key emergency services – the Royal Flying Doctor Service (RFDS), LifeFlight, and local Rural Fire Brigades.

Mayor George Seymour said the decision recognised the vital role these services play in keeping Fraser Coast residents safe.

“From bushfires to medical emergencies, these organisations are there for our community on some of the toughest days people will ever face,” he said.

Under the resolutions passed, Council will:

- Provide a one-year contribution of \$265,000 to the Rural Fire Service Qld to support Rural Fire Brigades on the Fraser Coast.
- Three-year agreements with the RFDS and LifeFlight, including waiving airport landing fees and an annual contribution of \$30,000 to each.

Council welcomes the State Government’s increased funding for Rural Fire Service Qld, with Council’s future contributions to Rural Fire Brigades reviewed each year as part of the annual budget.

Cr Seymour said the support is fully funded through Council’s Disaster Management and Resilience Levy on all rateable properties.

“This levy is one of the practical ways our community invests in its own safety and resilience,” he said.

“Our support for RFDS, LifeFlight and the Rural Fire Brigades reflects Council’s deep appreciation for their tireless work and our ongoing commitment to building a safer, more resilient Fraser Coast.”



New Fraser Coast bus stop signs helping passengers

Bus passengers across the Fraser Coast will see new poles and signs going up at local bus stops over the coming months.

FCRC Roads and Transport spokesperson Cr Denis Chapman said the changes were about making it easier for people to find their stop and understand where they are along the route.

“Public transport works best when it’s simple and clear,” Cr Chapman said.

“These new bus stop signs will be easier to see, easier to read and easier to match with the information on the Translink website and app.

“For regular bus users, it means more consistent information at every stop. For visitors and people who don’t catch the bus often, it should be easier to know where to get on and off.”

The upgrades include:

- replacing old poles with new, easy-to-see poles
- signs clearly showing updated bus stop name
- new case for timetable or bus route information.

Bus stop names on the signs are also being updated. Instead of only using the road name, many

stops will now use nearby cross streets or well-known places, such as a shopping centre, school or park.

“This naming system is already used in many parts of Qld and is designed to avoid bus stops having the same name at multiple locations along the same road. This will also help people match what they see at the bus stop with what they see on Translink’s website and app,” Cr Chapman said.

The work is being delivered by Council and is funded by the Queensland Department of Transport and Main Roads, through its Bus Stop Signage Improvements - Regional Refresh Program.

Works have started and are expected to be finished by the end of April 2026. Work will be done in stages across the region, and any short-term impacts at individual stops will be kept to a minimum.

Council encourages passengers to keep using their usual stops and to check the Translink website or Translink app for the latest service, stop and timetable information. A major upgrade is underway to make Denmans Camp Road and Totness Street safer, smoother and easier to use.

New Hervey Bay Community Hub takes shape

Work is powering ahead on the Hervey Bay Community Hub, which will be a new place for the whole community to learn, connect and create in the heart of the city.

Fraser Coast Mayor George Seymour said the project had passed several major construction milestones in 2025 and remained on budget ahead of its expected completion next year.

“This is a once-in-a-generation project that will transform the Hervey Bay City Centre,” he said.

“More than three-quarters of the building will be community space, including a larger library, creative spaces, meeting rooms and a public plaza.

“By bringing more people into the city centre, it will also help support local businesses and boost our local economy.”

This year saw the building’s structure reach its full height, followed by the rooftop plant and the library’s welcoming entrance staircase.

“From a big hole in the ground to a five-storey building, it’s been amazing to watch it rise over the past year,” Cr Seymour said.

“The next few months will see further transformation on site, with the removal of the tower crane and scaffolding, installation of an architectural sunscreen and rooftop solar panels, ground-floor landscaping and decking, and large whale sculptures inside the new library.

Infrastructure charges discount to boost housing diversity

FCRC has endorsed new incentives to help boost housing supply and encourage a wider mix.

“Our region doesn’t just need more houses – it needs more choice,” Development and Planning spokesperson Cr Paul Truscott said.

“Smaller homes, units, townhouses, supported accommodation and aged-care style housing all play an important role.

Infrastructure charges help fund services like roads, water, sewerage, stormwater systems and parks.

Under the new Housing Diversity Incentive, eligible townhouses, dual occupancies, community residences, rooming accommodation and residential care facilities in the appropriate residential zones will receive a 75 per cent discount on infrastructure charges.



“Final works will include façade cleaning, internal fit-out, testing and commissioning, with the hub expected to open in the second half of 2026.”

The Hervey Bay Community Hub will include:

- Two-level library, more space & modern facilities
- A central customer service and Council administration centre
- Disaster Resilience Centre to help prepare for and respond to natural disasters
- Meeting rooms, creative spaces and flexible areas for public use
- An outdoor public plaza for community events and everyday enjoyment.

The Hervey Bay Library and Council Administration Centre is a commitment under the Hinkler Regional Deal, supported by \$40 million from the Australian Government.

Infrastructure charges discount to boost housing diversity

Lifestyle villages and over-50s relocatable home parks are not eligible as Council considers there is already strong supply in that market.

As part of the same new package, Council has also adopted a targeted discount to help unlock more housing in Maryborough and several rural and coastal towns.

From January, eligible subdivisions will receive an infrastructure charge discount of about 27 per cent.

“The tap is flowing in Hervey Bay, but in the southern part of the region, the tap is running dry.

Cr Truscott said the new incentives would run for two years and be reviewed as part of Council’s Investment Attraction Strategy.



Ingredients

Chicken Shawarma

1kg skinless chicken thighs
3 tbsp olive oil
2 tbsp each of ground cumin and coriander

- Preheat skillet over medium/high heat. Cook the chicken for 6-7 minutes per side, or until fully cooked and nicely charred.
- Remove from heat and let rest for a few minutes before slicing.
- For the sauce mix the yogurt, mayonnaise, minced garlic, lemon juice and salt.
- Service chicken sliced with pita bread or rice. Drizzle with sauce and garnish with parsley
