Our reforms include restricting e-mobility devices to over 16s, speed limits, licensing requirements, new seizure powers for police and the introduction of random breath testing for riders.

At Council, we have received our planning scheme amendment back for the state government with the tick of approval. Now is the most important stage, which is for the community to use the consultation phase to scrutinise and give feedback. This can be found simply "googling" Fraser Coast Planning Scheme community feedback, and you will find your way to the "Have your say" page. You can view the proposal, make a submission or book a 15-minute meeting with a planner to help understand any issues. This part really is vital as we need to know your view. I personally don't think it's perfect, and I hope to work through it again before adoption. Your feedback can help guide that process.

I am again disappointed that no announcements have come around funding for the pontoon, but hold hope that it still may come sooner rather than later. I have however, requested some preliminary data be collected to evidence the need for a review of the

configuration of the boat ramp precinct and requesting an updated design to submit for funding. River Heads boat ramp precinct sees hundreds of thousands of people every year, but more importantly, it is a vital piece of infrastructure for our community. It is not a fast process, but I will continue to take the steps to get the investment into it that reflects its importance to the local community, greater region and also as a world renowned tourist destination gateway.

I will also be hosting a community chat this month at the hall at the date and time below. Finally just another congratulations to River Heads Fishing Club, Number 1 in the region!

Proud owner and trainer Adam Whitaker was overcome with emotion after the big win – though he’s keeping his muddie’s training regime a secret until next year’s showdown.

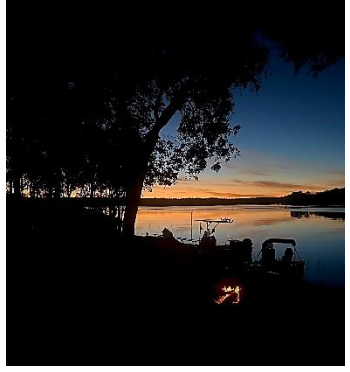

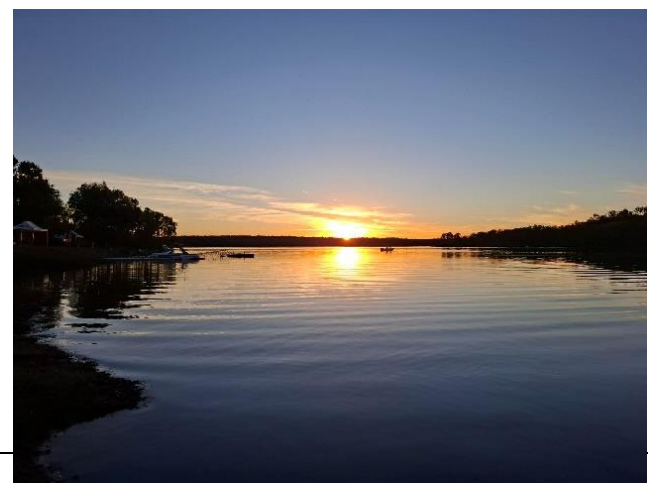

Wildlife Matters

What Bird is that?

Are you wondering what bird visited your birdbath this morning? Would you like to know the differences between certain species? Your queries will be answered by local ornithologist, Christine Heiser who will be the speaker for the Wildlife Library talk in April.

"I have over twelve years' experience as a birdwatcher, travelling locally, around Australia and overseas. In the last few years, I volunteered to be a vetting officer for Birdlife Australia's annual 'Aussie

Bird Count'. This was a wonderful opportunity to further my knowledge of where and what birds can be found at lesser known locations" Christine says.

"In my presentation, I will firstly identify the difference between a birdwatcher and a twitcher, which includes a little history of how birdwatching developed and how it is becoming such a popular interest. I will then explore the identification of birds locally, their environment, why they are in this area and what behaviours those birds have."

You can join Christine at the Hervey Bay Library on April 17 and in the Maryborough Library on April 24. Both talks run from 1pm to 2pm.

Packed program for Youth Week



A glow-in-the-dark beach party, fishing comps, laser skirmish battles and inflatable days at the aquatic centres are among more than 30 activities planned across the Fraser Coast for Youth Week.

Fraser Coast Deputy Mayor Sara Diana Faraj said more than 30 free and low-cost events would be held across the

region from 11 to 19 April as part of Queensland Youth Week.

“Highlights include Youth Fest at the All Abilities Park and Seafront Oval in Pialba, pump track music sessions with Bay Beats in Hervey Bay and Borough Beats in Maryborough, and Youth Maker Markets,” she said.

“Our young people are an important part of the Fraser Coast and Youth Week is a great opportunity to celebrate them while creating fun and welcoming spaces for them to connect with others,” she said.

Next step for dog beach rules

“Dog owners told us they wanted clear rules about where their dogs can be off-leash or on-leash, while many beachgoers also wanted dog-free swimming areas.” Animal Management spokesperson Cr John Weiland said.

“The changes give dog owners more space to exercise their pets while making sure our busiest swimming areas and important wildlife habitats are protected.”

Stage 2 changes planned for later in 2026 include:

- Extended dog-free stretch Scarness Jetty to Robert St
- Dog-free stretch from Reef World to Urangan Marina, a landmark-to-landmark boundary
- Shorebird protection zone Pulgul Creek and Moolyyir Creek September 1 to March 31
- Updated beach signage once changes are final.

These follow the introduction of 24 hour off-leash:

- **Scarness:** Toonan Toonan Ck to Scarness Jetty
- **Urangan:** Margaret St groyne to Dayman Park
- **Urangan:** Moolyyir Ck to Pulgul Ck (until Stage 2 begins)

On-leash areas remain available for people and dogs who prefer them. If a beach is not signed as off-leash or dog-free, dogs must be on a leash.

“Please remember that off-leash does not mean out of control. Dogs must remain under effective control

at all times and respond reliably to recall,” Councillor Weiland said.

“Off-leash areas are places where dogs will naturally approach and interact, so owners should make sure both they and their dog are comfortable socialising around other people and dogs.”

Animal desexing rebates extended

Council will temporarily double its animal desexing rebates to all residents during June.

Council agreed to increase payments under its Animal Desexing Reimbursement Incentive to \$200 for a dog and \$100 for a cat for desexing procedures carried out between 1 and 30 June 2026.

Residents must live in the Fraser Coast region and provide documentation confirming the animal was desexed within 60 days of the procedure.

The desexing rebate program is funded through animal registration fees, helping reinvest those funds into responsible pet ownership initiatives across the Fraser Coast.

Free native plants for local projects



Community groups, schools and environmental volunteers can soon apply for free native plants, with the first round of Council's 2026 Plant Donation Program on April 1.

Cr Zane O'Keefe said applications close on 31 May, supporting projects linked to National Tree Day and other local environmental initiatives.

"... Council donates locally grown native plants from the Fraser Coast Community Nursery to help community groups restore and enhance our natural environment," he said.

"The nursery, located at the northern end of the Hervey Bay Botanic Gardens, grows more than 300 species of local plants with the support of volunteers and staff."

Cr O'Keefe said the rounds were scheduled to ensure plants had time to grow and could be planted during suitable seasonal conditions.

Plants approved under Round 1 can be collected in July and ready for planting as part of National Tree Day activities July 26 and other projects.

Kauri Pine adopted as official tree

Council adopted the Kauri Pine as a symbol of the region's culture, history and natural environment.

Mayor George Seymour said the Kauri Pine grows naturally on K'gari and the mainland and was a fitting symbol for the region.

"It represents strength, endurance and the deep connection between our community and the natural environment. The Kauri Pine can live for more than a thousand years and grow up to 50 metres tall, making it one of Australia's most impressive rainforest trees," he said.

"By the 1860s, Kauri logs harvested from K'gari and surrounding forests were milled in Maryborough, helping establish the region as a centre for timber export, engineering and manufacturing," he said.

"Demand also contributed to the construction of Queensland's first steam locomotive, *Mary Ann*, built in Maryborough in 1873."

Cr Seymour said the species also held important cultural connections for the Butchulla People.

"Known traditionally as *Nunmoola*, the tree was used for medicine and tools and features in stories linking people to Country," he said.

The Mayor planted a Kauri Pine at Brendan Hansen Park in Granville in memory of the late Peter Olds OAM, who first suggested the species as the Fraser Coast's arboreal emblem.



Water and sewerage projects nominated for housing fund

Fraser Coast Regional Council will seek Queensland Government funding for two major water and sewerage projects with capacity to support more than 11,000 new homes across the region.

Council agreed to nominate the Fraser Coast Water Grid and Pulgul Sewage Treatment Plant upgrade for Round 2 of the Queensland Government's Residential Activation Fund.

"The Water Grid project will strengthen water supply connections between Maryborough and Hervey Bay, improving reliability and long-term water security." Cr Lachlan Cosgrove said.

"The Pulgul Sewage Treatment Plant upgrade will increase wastewater treatment capacity to support future residential growth across the region.

Cr Cosgrove said securing funding through the program would help accelerate infrastructure delivery while reducing costs for Council and ratepayers.



The Cheeky Home Cook creates – Cranberry chicken bake

Ingredients

2 chicken breasts
1tbsp olive oil
½ tsp salt
Pinch pepper
1 tsp dried thyme

Cranberry sauce

½ cup cranberry sauce
2 tbsp honey
1 tbsp olive oil
1 tsp Dijon mustard
Juice half a lemon

Ricotta topping

½ cup ricotta cheese
1 tbsp olive oil
1 tbsp parsley chopped
Pinch pepper

Method

- Preheat oven to 200C. Place chicken breasts in baking dish and season with olive oil, salt, pepper and thyme.
- In a small bowl mix cranberry sauce, honey, olive oil, Dijon mustard and lemon juice.
- Pour the cranberry mix over the chicken and bake for 20-25 minutes until chicken is fully cooked.
- Remove from the oven and add dollops of ricotta cheese on top. Return to the oven for 5 minutes until slightly warmed.
- Serve with a fresh salad and enjoy.
