I also met with several Ministers to progress key projects in Hervey Bay, including the Urangan Harbour Master Plan and upgrades to the Burrum

Misunderstood Neighbours: Human and Wildlife Interactions

Have you gotten the fright of your life when stumbling across a snake sunning itself on your footpath?

Community news – River Heads First Responders

Hello everyone,

Lately your local First Responders have been taking advantage of some wonderful training opportunities provided by Queensland Ambulance Service (QAS).

During March, the team attended a weekend of training sessions covering Advanced Resuscitation (CPR), Oxygen Therapy, and Pain Management certificates, also updating our Drug Management protocols.

This rather full weekend was hosted by our colleagues at Marine Rescue Queensland (Hervey Bay) in their training rooms, with the QAS trainer travelling from Brisbane to deliver the most up-to-date and relevant information and practice scenario/exam sessions.

In April, four of your team also attended the QAS district's annual exercise, which was conducted at Urraween QAS Station. They learned how to conduct the early stages of a serious multi-casualty situation, to be effective during the time paramedics, police and fire are on their way to the scene.

We also contributed, alongside colleagues from the First Responder group attached to Marine Rescue Queensland (Hervey Bay) to assisting our local paramedics at the main Anzac Day parade and service at Hervey Bay.

This is an exercise the group undertakes each year, at the request of our local QAS leaders, and it is a real honour to be able to support our community in this way at what usually proves to be quite a hard time for both our older folk and younger marchers during the heat of the day.

As always, we are needing more recruits to expand our service. With excellent training, all equipment, uniforms and support provided by QAS – all you need is a driver's licence, moderate fitness, and a willingness to learn and give even one day a week to your community.

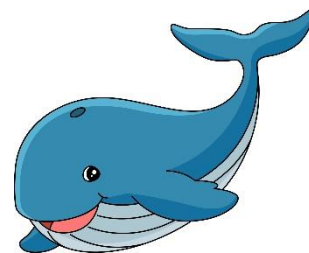
Future plans

Double desexing rebates next month



Fraser Coast residents are encouraged to book early with their local vet ahead of Council temporarily doubling its animal desexing rebates available to all residents during June.

Council will increase its Animal Desexing Reimbursement Incentive to \$200 for dogs and \$100 for cats for procedures carried out between 1 and 30 June 2026.

Animal Management spokesperson Cr Michelle Byrne said with June fast approaching, now was the time for pet owners to lock in appointments.

“This is a great opportunity to save money while doing the right thing for your pet and the wider community.”

Cr Byrne said the initiative was designed to make desexing more affordable and accessible.

“We know cost can be a barrier for some people, and by doubling the rebate for June, we’re helping remove that barrier,” she said.

“Desexing your pet now can also lead to long-term savings, including reduced registration fees.”

Cr Byrne said desexing played a key role in improving animal welfare.

“It helps prevent unwanted litters and can reduce behaviours like roaming and fighting,” she said.

“That’s better for pets, their owners and the community.”

Cr Byrne said the program was funded through animal registration fees, reinvested in responsible pet ownership initiatives across the region.

Hervey Bay Half Marathon filling fast

The inaugural Hervey Bay Half Marathon Festival is filling fast, with more than 2,200 participants already registered and just 200 places left in the headline event, two months out from race day.

Fraser Coast Mayor George Seymour said the strong response showed the level of excitement for the June 21 event and the opportunity it offers.

The event is attracting a wide range of participants, from a four-year-old in the Macca’s 2km Mini Marathon to a 91-year-old in the half-marathon.

Runners will also travel from around the world, with 13 international participants already registered.

Organisers are calling for around 300 volunteers to assist with roles including course support, aid stations, registration and event setup.



Local businesses are encouraged to take part in the Runner’s Local Passport Program, which offers promotions to visiting runners during event week.

Wearable Art Showcase expands Waste to Art



A standalone Fashion Showcase at the Bolgra Theatre in Maryborough is set to take centre stage in this year's Waste to Art Competition, with entries now open across all categories.

Now in its ninth year, the Waste to Art competition invites people of all ages to transform everyday waste destined for landfill into creative works and wearable fashion.

Fraser Coast Regional Council Resource Recovery spokesperson Cr Michelle Byrne said the addition of a dedicated Fashion Showcase reflected growing interest in wearable art and the importance of tackling textile waste.

"It's a fun and powerful way to highlight the growing issue of clothing and textile waste while encouraging people to think differently about what they throw away," she said.

"The 2026 showcase will be held on Saturday 7 November, a week ahead of the main exhibition, with garments then displayed alongside other artworks at Gatakers Artspace from 14 November."

Entry is free, with six categories available:

- 18 yrs +: 1st: \$1,500 | 2nd: \$500 | 3rd: \$350

Cr Byrne said the community can vote for their favourite piece in the People's Choice.

"Entries are open until 16 October, with artworks to be exhibited from 14 November at Gatakers Artspace in Maryborough."

Blooming plant sale at Botanic Gardens Open Day



Fraser Coast residents are in for a blooming treat, with a colourful plant sale set to be a highlight of the Hervey Bay Botanic Garden Open Day this month, including Kauri Pines – the new official tree of the Fraser Coast.

The open day will be held on Sunday May 24 9am to 12pm, giving locals the chance to explore the gardens, enjoy family-friendly activities and take home a new plant.

Fraser Coast Deputy Mayor Lachlan Cosgrove said about 2,000 plants will be available for purchase starting from just \$3, including melaleucas, local koala food trees, a selection of rainforest species from our region, and the iconic Kauri Pine - the official tree of the Fraser Coast.



The Cheeky Home Cook creates – Sweet potato fritters with spinach feta dip

Ingredients

2 medium sweet potatoes (500g)
1 egg
1/4 cup plain flour
2 tbsp olive oil
1/2 tsp salt
1/4 tsp black pepper

Spinach feta dish

1 cup fresh spinach
1/2 cup feta cheese
2 tbsp Greek yogurt
1 tbsp olive oil
1 clove garlic minced



Method

- Grate the sweet potato and squeeze excess moisture through a clean cloth
- Mix sweet potatoes, egg, flour, salt and black pepper in a bowl.
- Heat oil in a pan over medium heat.
- Form small fritters from the mixture and fry for 3-4 minutes on each side until golden and crispy.
- Blend the finely shredded spinach, feta, Greek yogurt, olive oil and garlic until creamy.
- Serve the fritters hot with the feta sauce
- Garnish with a drizzle of hot honey and chopped parsley, dill and chives.
