In other development news for our area, works are currently taking place on the western side of River Heads Road/Ariadne Street. After making enquiries,

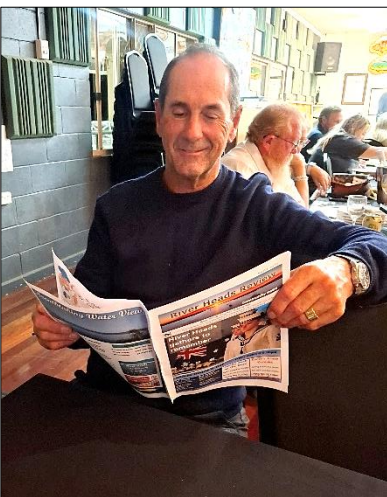

Wildlife Matters – Library Talk

It is quite a common practice to miss the scenery as we drive on the highway surrounding us. However, there is one flora species that stands out from the grey-green Wallum and that species is the grass tree [Xanthorrhoea] - endemic to Australia.

The June Wildlife Library talk will be presented by Lindsay Titmarsh, renowned local identity and owner of Tandora on the Mary-Susan River system. He will be speaking on the Tandora grasstrees. The property has thousands of acres of grasstrees, quite often numbering many hundreds in a small area. Many topics will be covered including growth rates, bush fires, cause of flowering, reason for multi heads and toxicity to cattle.


Grass trees are the first plants in the bush to recover after a fire. Although they are slow growing, their flower spears grow at an astonishing rate. They have hidden growth rings.

Birds and bees depend on the nectar from the flowers. There are two species growing at Tandora. Many years ago, grass trees killed more of the property's cattle than anything else.


Multi-heads are formed only after certain conditions are met, and then they only flower prolifically after certain weather events.



Make sure you don't miss this fascinating talk by Lindsay. He will be speaking in the Hervey Bay Library on June 19 and in the Maryborough Library on June 26. Talks run from 1-2pm.

Winter events to add \$7 million boost

More than 30,000 visitors and locals are expected to attend 18 major events across the Fraser Coast over the next three months, generating more than \$7 million in economic benefits for the region.

Deputy Mayor and Events spokesperson Cr Lachlan Cosgrove said Council's investment in attracting and supporting events was delivering real economic benefits while creating more opportunities for residents to enjoy high-quality experiences.

"Events bring real benefits to our region, from supporting accommodation providers and hospitality venues through to creating flow-on opportunities for local businesses and showcasing the Fraser Coast to new audiences," he said.

"By attracting major sporting events and festivals, we're not only delivering experiences for our community, but also positioning the Fraser Coast as a destination capable of hosting increasingly larger events into the future, including opportunities linked to the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games."

Among the sporting events is the Hervey Bay Half Marathon on June 21, the Under 14 Girls Hockey State Championships from June 28 to July 1 and the All-Girls Statewide Rugby League Carnival which includes the BMD Premiership game in July.

"The Fraser Coast will also host a Queensland Pickleball Tournament in August, reflecting the rapid growth of one of Australia's fastest-growing sports," he said.

"...followed by Garagefest, a two-day automotive festival featuring classic cars, live entertainment and family activities on June 20 and 21.

"The Odyssey Festival, celebrating retro music and nostalgia with tribute performances and camping experiences, will take place in July, while the much-loved Mary Poppins Festival returns to Maryborough on July 5.

"Our events calendar is not just focused on Hervey Bay and Maryborough, with events also bringing visitors and activity to smaller communities through initiatives such as the Tiaro Field Day, Tiaro Bulls and Barrels and the Burrum Coal Discovery Festival.

"Our region offers fantastic venues, a supportive community and experiences that competitors and visitors genuinely enjoy, which is why more event organisers are choosing the Fraser Coast."



Young people to help shape region's future

Young people across the Fraser Coast will have more opportunities to shape Council decisions under a new Youth Engagement Framework endorsed by Fraser Coast Regional Council.

The Framework will help Council better understand what matters to young people and use those insights to inform future planning.

This includes issues such as education, job opportunities, housing, recreation and broader lifestyle factors that influence whether young people choose to stay and build a future on the Fraser Coast.

The Framework was developed following a motion raised by Cr Faraj seeking ways to better understand the priorities and aspirations of young people aged approximately 12 to 24 years.

The Framework proposes several ways to better understand the needs and priorities of young people, including - Dedicated youth engagement activities; Ongoing feedback through existing Council interactions; Research into social and economic trends; and stronger partnerships with organisations working with young people.

Information gathered through the Framework will help shape Council planning, advocacy, and future programs, as well as annual work priorities.

Cr Faraj said the aim was to ensure young people's feedback leads to practical outcomes.

Council backs Time Cannon tradition

Fraser Coast Regional Council has endorsed actions to protect and preserve Maryborough's Time Cannon collection while supporting efforts to reinstate the city's long-standing weekly Time Cannon firing tradition.

The original Dutch East India Cannon, gifted to the city in 1877, was fired daily until 1890 at 1pm by the Electric Telegraph Department to allow residents to keep time until the installation of the Town Clock.

Replica cannons were introduced in 1988 to reinvigorate the heritage story through weekly market firings and ceremonial events, becoming known as the Maryborough Time Cannon.

Council endorsed relocating the cannons to compliant storage, strongly supporting efforts to reinstate the weekly Time Cannon firing tradition and seeking further investigations before any additional actions are taken.

The decision follows extensive consultation with the Queensland Police Weapons Licensing Branch, which confirmed firing cannot continue under current laws after Council's cannons were classified as Category R artillery.

Cr Paul Truscott said the community's connection to the Time Cannon remained strong.

"For almost 150 years, the Time Cannon has been part of Maryborough's story, and many people feel strongly about protecting that history," he said.

"That's why Council has spent significant time exploring whether there was a safe and legal way for firing to continue before receiving advice confirming it cannot continue under current laws.

"While Council must respond to the advice we have received, we don't want to see the story of the Time Cannon end here.

"Council has strongly endorsed the return of the weekly Time Cannon firing tradition, and we have written to the Queensland Premier seeking support to explore whether there may still be opportunities to preserve this important part of Maryborough's identity.

"Our focus now is on protecting the cannons while continuing to explore opportunities to recognise and celebrate the Time Cannon for future generations."



Brolga takes live music to aged-care facilities

Fraser Coast aged-care residents are enjoying live music from the comfort of their homes, with the Brolga Theatre's Morning Melodies program taking live performances into facilities across the region.

Mayor George Seymour said the popular program is now in its second year, delivering live shows to 18 aged-care facilities across the Fraser Coast.

"Music has the power to spark joy, bring back memories and create a real sense of connection," he said.

"Many of our senior residents can't easily visit the theatre, so we're taking the experience to them.

"Each performance features a Fraser Coast local musician and gives residents a chance to sing along, connect and enjoy something special."

Cr Seymour said the strong response from last year has led to the program becoming a regular part of the Brolga Theatre's offering.

"We're now halfway through this year's program, and the feedback from residents and staff has been incredibly positive," he said.

"Eight performances remain in this year's series, with the final show scheduled for June 30 at Parklands Aged Care.

"Given the response so far, we're planning to continue the program next year, so even more residents can experience the benefits of live music."



Ingredients

- 1 tbsp oil
- 1 onion finely chopped
- 3 cloves minced garlic
- 1 tbsp ginger grated
- 2 tbsp curry powder
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 1 tsp turmeric
- 1 cup red lentils, rinsed
- 2 medium sweet potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 1 can coconut milk
- 3 cups vegetable stock
- 1 can diced tomatoes (optional)
- Handful of spinach leaves
- Salt and pepper
- Fresh coriander or parsley garnish



The Cheeky Home Cook creates – Sweet potato, red lentil and coconut curry

Method

- Heat oil in a large pot and saute onions until soft then add garlic and ginger.
- Stir in curry powder, cumin and turmeric
- Add red lentils, sweet potato, coconut milk, vegetable stock and diced tomatoes (if needed)
- Stir well while you bring to the boil then simmer gently for 30 minutes or until lentils are soft and sweet potato is tender.
- Add spinach leaves last minute to wilt.
- Season with salt and pepper and serve hot with rice and flat bread
- Garnish with coriander or parsley

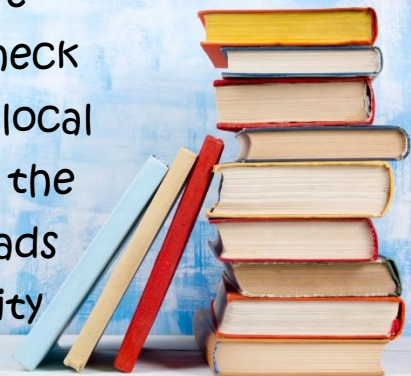
