There are some positions where the incumbents are not re nominating and require new members for the committee.

To quote the famous saying from President J.F. Kennedy "Ask not what the Progress Association can do for you but ask what you can do for the Progress Association".

We all enjoy a good time and the members who serve you at the Bistro and Sunday Sesh are all volunteers. This is how the Association survives. I look forward to seeing you at the AGM.

It's a new financial year, and the biggest council project in our history is almost complete. The new community library and admin centre has sparked mixed views, but this council inherited the responsibility to deliver it, and we've

done that. Yes, it's been a significant cost, but it will allow us to cut staff worksite expenses by reducing our current 53 sites which will achieve ongoing savings in our operational budget. The official opening is on August 31, and if you're in town I encourage you to drop in and see it for yourself.

Last month, council adopted a budget that includes a 5.08% rates rise. Given the cumulative cost burden on ratepayers since we were elected, and the clear feedback from my recent "budget-focused" community chat series, I opposed another above-CPI increase throughout the process. Our Deputy Mayor Cr

Cosgroves, Cr Paul Truscott, Cr Daniel Sanderson and I all voted against the budget. My position was to challenge each department to find efficiencies, savings and to refocus on core business. The vote was lost 7-4, but I will continue to represent the views of Division 7 residents in future budget discussions.

I also want to acknowledge growing concerns about property damage and theft at the boat ramp precinct. It's not enough to simply say this is a police matter, so I have formally requested that council increase lighting and CCTV coverage in the area. I'll be pushing for these improvements through the upcoming budget process, to help make the precinct safer for everyone who uses it.

I know many residents and regular users of the River Heads pontoon, have been keen to hear about progress on the floating walkway and pontoon upgrade.

I'm pleased to advise Maritime Safety Queensland has confirmed the project funded, recognising River Heads as one of our region's most important marine access points for both passenger and recreational vessels.

The existing pontoon has experienced ongoing damage from flooding/wave action over several years.

This new design has been chosen to improve:

- Safety for users
- Resilience to weather and marine conditions
- Vessel manoeuvrability; and berthing efficiency

While construction is anticipated to begin by early 2027, important planning work is already

underway. This includes environmental and cultural heritage assessments, detailed design work, approvals and procurement processes that must be completed before construction can commence.

I understand the community is eager to see these improvements delivered, and I have been advised that the project is being progressed as quickly as practicable while ensuring all Queensland Government requirements are met.

River Heads plays a vital role as the gateway to Fraser (K'Gari) Island and our beautiful Great Sandy Strait, and this upgrade will help ensure the facility can safely and effectively meet community and visitor demand well into the future.

I will continue to keep the community informed as further milestones are reached and more information becomes available.

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Support for Fraser Coast's creative community



Fraser Coast artists, creatives and community organisations will soon be able to apply for a share of \$50,000 in funding to deliver projects that celebrate local stories, develop creative skills and bring arts experiences to the community.

The Regional Arts Development Fund (RADF) is part of a broader \$120,000 investment in local arts and culture delivered in partnership with the Queensland Government through Arts Queensland.

"The funding can support everything from professional development and workshops to exhibitions, performances and community projects that celebrate our stories and connect people through creativity," Cr Sara Soublis said.

"Arts and culture play an important role in creating vibrant communities, strengthening our local identity and supporting our creative economy, and this program helps ensure those opportunities continue to grow."

The Program offers grants across three categories:

- **Participate** – up to \$1,000 to help local artists build their skills through professional development opportunities;
- **Develop** – up to \$3,000 to support projects that build creative skills and capacity; and
- **Share** – up to \$10,000 for projects that encourage the Fraser Coast community to

participate in and celebrate arts, culture and heritage.

Recent RADF-supported projects have included the *Where I Belong* Art Story Wall in Hervey Bay, the *Best of Broadway* concert by the Fraser Coast Orchestra, *Mindful Mandalas* art workshops and intergenerational film-making projects inspired by *Mary Poppins*.

The RADF program also includes \$70,000 to deliver strategic Council-led arts initiatives aligned with the Fraser Coast Arts and Culture Strategy.

Cr Souvlis encouraged anyone with a creative idea that would benefit the Fraser Coast community to consider applying.

"Whether you're an emerging artist looking to develop your skills or an organisation planning a project that brings people together through arts and culture, we'd love to hear your ideas," she said.

"The Cultural Services team is available to help applicants understand the program and develop their proposals, so I encourage people to get in touch and explore what's possible."

Applications open July 29, 2026 and can be submitted throughout the year until March 29, 2027, with funding assessed across three rounds, subject to available funding. Projects must commence after September 21, 2026.

Record low unemployment for Fraser Coast

The Fraser Coast's unemployment rate has fallen to a record low of 4.5 per cent as the region continues to build economic momentum.

March 2026 quarter unemployment rate, down from 5.4 per cent in the previous quarter, is the lowest recorded for the Fraser Coast since comparable local government area data became available.

The figures from the Australian Government's Small Area Labour Markets program, uses Australian Bureau of Statistics labour force data.

Fraser Coast Mayor George Seymour welcomed the result, saying it reflected growing confidence in the region while reinforcing the importance of continuing to create opportunities for local people.

"This is a fantastic result for the Fraser Coast and an encouraging sign that our local economy is heading in the right direction," he said.

"A record low unemployment rate means more people are finding work, more families are benefiting from secure incomes, and more businesses are able to grow."



Cr Seymour said Council remained focused on creating the conditions for long-term economic growth through its *Fraser Coast Futures 2036 – For a Better Future, Built Together* Economic Development Strategy.

"That strategy sets an ambitious goal of growing our economy by \$2 billion by 2036, attracting new investment and creating more opportunities for young professionals, skilled tradespeople and families to build their future here on the Fraser Coast," he said.

SplashSide to close for annual maintenance

SplashSide at Anzac Park in Maryborough will temporarily close for six weeks from Monday, August 3 to Sunday, September 13 while essential annual maintenance is carried out.

Fraser Coast Regional Council Parks and Playgrounds spokesperson Cr Daniel Sanderson said the planned closure was an important part of ensuring one of the region's most popular attractions continues working safely and reliably.

"SplashSide is a favourite destination for local families and visitors, so we need to take the time each year to give it the care it needs," he said.

"Although SplashSide will be closed for a few weeks, carrying out this maintenance during the cooler months means families can enjoy the park

with fewer disruptions when the warmer weather arrives.

"This year we're also refreshing some of SplashSide's most-loved features, including the giant tipping bucket and roller slide, to keep them in great condition for years to come."

During the closure, crews will service pumps, filtration systems, and other mechanical equipment, inspect and clean water tanks, maintain electrical and water quality systems, pressure-clean the play equipment, and refurbish the tipping bucket and roller slide.

SplashSide will reopen on Monday 14 September, ready for the September school holidays, weather and construction conditions permitting.



Ingredients

8 chicken drumsticks
2 tbsp olive oil
1 large onion sliced
5 garlic cloves minced
1 tbsp fresh ginger grated
2 tbsp tomato paste
1 can crushed tomatoes
1 cup chicken stock
1 tbsp smoked paprika
1 Tsp each of: sweet paprika, cayenne pepper, ground cumin, dried oregano & thyme
½ tsp black pepper
1 tsp salt
1 tsp brown sugar
1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce
1 bay leaf
2 tbsp chopped parsley



The Cheeky Home Cook creates – Braised chicken in tomato & herb gravy

Method

- Sauté onion, add garlic and ginger and cook
- Add tomato paste and cook for two minutes then add smoked paprika, sweet paprika, cayenne, cumin, oregano & thyme, cook for 3 mins
- Pour in the crushed tomatoes and chicken stock, Worcestershire sauce, brown sugar and bay leave.
- Brown the chicken legs on all sides and add to the sauce, simmer for 45-55 minutes over low heat
- Remove lid and simmer a little longer to reduce.
- Sprinkle with parsley before serving with mashed potato or rice.

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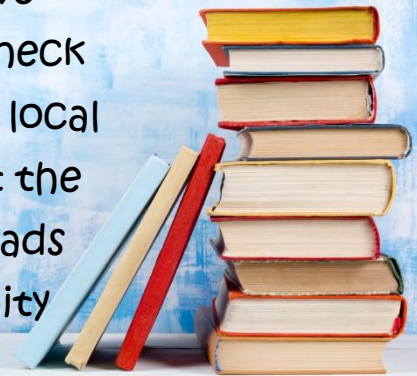
